





AN OASIS FOR REFUGEES



Emma arrived in Cyprus with hopes of finding a new life. She arrived with nothing, and found a country with a housing crisis that's struggling to cope with the number of new arrivals. She didn't know who to turn to for help.

Emma isn't her real name. Five years ago her life was threatened after her fiancé got entangled with corrupt officials in Cameroon. With her life threatend, her only option was the leave the country.

A fellow refugee directed her to the Oasis welcome centre, which offers essential services like language classes, food distribution, and emotional support. Emma found the community there welcoming and generous, inspiring her to volunteer at the centre after experiencing their kindness first-hand.

Emma now volunteers at the centre, helping to book appointments for people

to collect clothing and food. She sees it as the perfect way to give back after the welcome she received and as a way she can live out God's command to care for those in need.

Five years later, Emma still awaits her refugee status and is unable to leave Cyprus, even after the recent loss of her sister. Despite this heartbreak, the Oasis centre has been her lifeline, offering prayers and assistance as she navigates her situation. Emma expresses gratitude for the support she receives and hopes to reunite with her family.

She requests prayers for both herself and the Oasis centre, which has recently expanded its facilities to better serve refugees. The centre's new computer lab and craft room aim to enhance job skills for those in need. Emma emphasises that these resources are vital for helping refugees like her find stability and a sense of belonging in their new home. Her story highlights the importance of community support in overcoming adversity and rebuilding lives after trauma

The de facto leaders of Afghanistan have introduced new laws banning women from speaking in public and requiring them to wear a full veil when leaving home. We spoke to the BMS World Mission team in country to find out how these laws will affect women – and how we can pray for Afghanistan.

BMS workers Ruby* and Reeta* in Afghanistan report that the laws have created fear and uncertainty among women. There are concerns about harsh enforcement, including potential beatings or detentions for non-compliance. The impact varies across the country, with rural women already facing severe restrictions, while more educated urban women see their dreams and freedoms vanishing.

Ruby and Reeta had spoken with some of the younger women about what they know about the new laws: "Some think it would be better if they were born a boy or even not to have been born at all. Some still study online when the have the money for the internet. They try for all the possible scholarships to be able to get out and have freedom but so few countries will accept them due to where they are from. On a weekly basis we hear them say that the rest of the world has forgotten about them, they no longer care that they are invisible."

The team are concerned about what new laws might mean for BMS' work in the country. They are continually assessing how both the staff and women they work with be kept safe. Women are among the most vulnerable in their communities. Widows in particular have little choice but to live off charity. There is a great need to allow continued engagement with vulnerable women in a way that does not put them at further risk.

When the future is so frightening and uncertain, your prayers are urgently needed for the women of Afghanistan. But even in the face of such cruelty, you can remain confident of this: "that you will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord (Psalm 27: 13-14)."
