





PASSING THE BATON OF HOPE



As millions celebrated the Olympic games back in July, Baptist churches in Paris also joined the festivities.

BMS World Mission workers John and Sue Wilson welcomed a short-term mission team from America. They engaged with the local community through events like K-Pop nights, table tennis competitions and conversation cafés aimed at helping visitors practice new languages. These activities were designed to make visitors feel welcome and provide opportunities for Christians to share the gospel.

Additionally, young people from Baptist churches in southern Paris collaborated on a digital mission project, using social media to discuss the Christian faith and connect enquirers with local churches.

One church in central Paris hosted an art exhibition titled *Hymnal – humanity* gathered, showcasing various artists.

The exhibition's opening featured Broadway actor Rich Swingle performing excerpts from his play *Beyond the chariots*. The play is about Eric Liddell's life as a missionary after winning gold in the 400 metres at the 1924 Games in Paris – the subject of the famous film, Chariots of Fire.

Churches have also been reaching out directly to fans on the streets, with up to 10,000 evangelists engaging in conversations about faith and sport while distributing special editions of the New Testament that include testimonies from Christian athletes.

As athletes are filled with the hopes of victory, these church communities are boldly passing on a different kind of hope – one of eternal and abundant life in Jesus. John and Sue Wilson, and Philip and Rosemary Halliday, are so encouraged by the unity of Baptist churches in France and their ongoing witness during the Olympic and Paralympic Games. Thank you so much for your prayers – churches in France could not run the race of faith without you cheering them on!
